<u>Rota-Kids</u> – Friday 2nd November saw Julie Grundy from Tyldesley Rotary come into school to meet with staff, governors and some of our very own Rota-Kids. There are 16 children in our Rota-Kids group and all the children have now been presented with their badges. On the day, our Rota-Kids received their 'official accreditation' (which we will soon be displaying in school) and the children discussed possible future projects going forward. One exciting project involved working with Santander, who will hopefully be coming in soon, delivering workshops to classes on handling money.

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20 years celebration – We started our 20 years celebrations, 20 years to the day that both St. George's School and Tyldesley Central School closed their doors for the final time. A fantastic assembly led by Mrs Davies, Miss Gray, Mrs Jeffries and Mrs Wright started the day as we reflected on images and stories from November 1998. Each class then went away to research different areas from that era, which they then presented in a sharing assembly later that week – it was great to see the work from each year class. Christmas disco


This will take place on **Thursday 20th December** at the following times for each year group:

October half term saw children from our school join with children from 5 other schools to attend the first ever 'All Sports Holiday Provision'. A varied programme of sporting opportunities (Athletics with Jenny Meadows, First Aid and Fun Swim, Football with Wigan Athletic and Rugby With Leigh Community Trust) were on offer over the 5 days with KS2 children being able to sign up for different days for £3 a day (with lunch included)!
