We have quickly arrived at the end of our first half term. School will close today and re – open for children on <u>Monday 29th October</u> <u>2018 (first bell at 8:45am with school starting at 8:55am)</u>. <u>Christian Values</u> – I was recently asked about the wonderful artwork on display in our school hall (see below). I am sure you have been in our school hall many times and marvelled at it. Like most things we do in school, there is a reason why this display is up for all to see. This artwork was developed from designs put together by our children and it represents the Christian Values of our school. We did lots of work with our children at the time, developing their ideas of what they believed to be the Christian Values that would best 'represent' the distinctiveness of our school and which Bible stories linked in with each Value. Each day, we look for specific examples of how our children 'live out' these Christian Values and children are regularly rewarded for this.



Each half term, we have a particular focus on one of the Values in Whole School Worship and children will undertake work on this in class, with displays also linking in. Each class also has a 'focus' Value which becomes the 'bedrock' of the work they undertake throughout the year:

Nursery/Reception: Friendship Year 1: Compassion Year 2: Forgiveness Year 3: Hope Year 4: Trust Year 5: Justice Year 6: Endurance

The whole school Christian Value we will be focusing on when we return to school after half term will be: **Compassion**. We look forward to hearing children's ideas of how we can show this in our daily interactions with each other.

Reading at home - Many thanks to you for supporting your children with their learning by remembering to listen to them read at home at least three times a week and sign in their planner. You are making a huge positive difference in doing this as this will not only support your child with their learning and achievement levels in schools but it will help them later in life when they come to face many tasks where reading skills are needed. In planners, teachers should be seeing at least three signatures, with page numbers and short comments per week.

Day of Action – It was great to see so many of children involved in the 'Day of Action' on Shakerley estate on Friday 5th October. As well as our children, members of the Fire Service, Police and local community workers were on hand. Our children carried out a litter pick in the area. We are very proud at our school of the links we have with our local community and so it was great to see our children getting involved with this.





Open afternoon with HT Forum – Tuesday 10th October saw school open its doors fully for this year's first open afternoon with Headteacher forum. We welcomed parents/carers of children in nursery, reception and KS1 into school to spend part of the afternoon in classes and then part of the afternoon having some refreshments in the school hall where I was available to answer any questions about school and life at St. George's Central. 20 years celebration – 2018/19 will see our school celebrate the amalgamation of St. George's School and Tyldesley Central School to become St. George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery as we know it now. I do know how much each school was well respected in this community its own right and I do find myself regularly correcting people (usually at important meetings) who do not give our school its full name and title!

I know how many people will have their own special memories of their time at either school and so it's only right that our school name represents both former schools. Therefore, if my research is correct, the time of amalgamation was between November 1998 and April 1999 and so we have a host of activities and events planned in school during this time period, which will include: sharing assemblies, a time capsule, an exhibition of work, photographs, artefacts, a film, an open day and a whole school art project which we are aiming to start in November and unveil (fingers crossed) on St. George's Day in 2019. If you or anyone you know could contribute to any aspect of this project, maybe sharing special memories for the film, then please do not hesitate to contact us in school.



Remembrance Sunday parade – Upon our return to school after half term, letters will be sent out asking for children to take part in the annual Remembrance Sunday parade on Sunday 11th November. Look out for the letter sent out upon our return to school. The Tyldesley Branch of the British Legion will be in school as part of our whole school worship on

Thursday 8th November when our children will be not only listening to our visitors, but also sharing some of the work with them that they have recently undertaken on the theme of '100 years ago', as 2018 marks 100 years since the end of the First World War.

Please remember that your child needs a water bottle in school every day. We do have water dispensers where they can refill their bottles but for hygiene reasons we would prefer the use of individual bottles rather than cups.

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<u>'Prime Parent Partnerships' Workshop</u> – We will be having a workshop for parents/carers of our Nursery children on Monday 12th November. This will be a very informal session and is aimed at families of children from both our school nursery and our Lancaster Avenue Nursery. This session will take place in school at 9:15am and at Lancaster Avenue at 3:15pm. You are welcome to attend either session. Come along and join in activities to support your child's development in the 'Prime' areas of learning and take home some

resources for you to use at home. This session will be run twice on the day and so a letter will sent out soon asking you to select which session you would like to attend. We look forward to seeing you.

Stephen has now taken away the children's work to finish the work which we are hoping will be installed at the Community Centre soon.









<u>Wigan Sports Awards</u> – The evening of Friday 12th October saw our school celebrate success at the annual 'Believe Wigan Sports Awards'. Our school was entered into the 'The Martin Lynn School Commitment to PE and Sport' category. It was never going to be easy, being up against 8 other excellent schools from across Wigan. Thanks must go to the hard work of Mr Cooke as our PE leader and all our fantastic staff and school governors who give up their time to ensure that the children at our school not only have opportunities within

their PE lessons and beyond the school day, but also ensure they support our children through helping them take part in the wide variety of events that are on offer within our community. Of course, this could not be done without the support of all our families and our children and so thank you for supporting us through ensuring your children have the correct kit, returning letters on time and generally ensuring that they are prepared to take part in their lessons and competitions.
