<u>Autumn Term</u> – Autumn Term is very much underway and this week, all children will have received their Autumn Term booklet which includes the targets for learning that we will be focusing on for your child. Over the coming month there are a number of things that you can look out for, and talk about, with your children during this



colourful season; changes in colours, collecting fallen leaves, conkers, different vegetables in season such as turnips, pumpkins, carrots and the different squashes there are. Our pre-school children recently made their own vegetable soup which they had for their snack!



<u>Harvest Festival</u> – All this week the children have been learning about Harvest Festival. They have learnt new songs, talked about what happens on a farm as well as being creative with fruit and vegetables. Pre-school children have been reading 'The Enormous Turnip' and 'Oliver's Vegetable Patch' and children in our Toddler Room have been reading 'Wow said the Owl'.



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<u>Stay and Play</u> – Just a reminder that our Stay and Play sessions will be taking place next week on **Monday 1st** October, 1pm-3pm and Thursday 4th October, 9am-11am. Please make sure that you have returned the slip with your preferred time and date so we know when to expect you. As well as discussing your child's general development there will also be a focus on 'Communication and Language', which is one of the areas of Early Years

development. We look forward to seeing you next week.
