Further information regarding the phased return to school on Monday 8th June 2020

- *We have been provided with a Generic Risk Assessment from Wigan Council and have also a specific St. George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery Risk Assessment in place;
- *Please ensure that you adhere to, and manage your own, social distancing measures in and around our sites when arriving and leaving. School staff will be on hand to support you with this;
- *The specific smaller groups of children will be arranged once we know who will be attending school on Monday 8th June. Many children informed me last week that they were missing their friends and so we will account for this when organising any groups;
- *Wearing a school uniform is desirable, but a school outdoor PE kit will be fine. School staff will let your child know the specific day they will be required to wear this kit to school for their outdoor PE lesson;
- *For Lancaster Avenue Nursery children, various Nursery doors will open from **9:00am**. Ms Naughton will be on hand outside nursery from 8:45am to direct you and your child to their 'drop off' and 'collection' point;
- *For Darlington Street Nursery children, our usual nursery door will be open from **9:00am**. I will be on hand outside this area to ensure that your child's arrival at nursery adheres to government guidance;
- *For children in Reception, Year 1, Year 6 and for the children of key workers and other identified children, classroom doors will be open from **8:30am**. These doors will close at **9:15am** and so please ensure that you make full use of the **45 minutes** that doors will be open when planning your arrival at school (if you have a child in one of these groups and a child in nursery, then please aim for a 'later' arrival time to avoid waiting for nursery doors to open at 9:00am);
- *Please avoid touching or accessing any of our resources on our sites. This includes any pieces of movable or fixed equipment;
- *Should you wish to speak to any of our staff (including the school or nursery office), please telephone or email so as to avoid large numbers of people waiting at classroom doors or the school/nursery office;
- *If every child at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery attended their nursery sessions during the week Monday 8th June, then we would be able to group the children into smaller groups of no more than **6 children**;
- *If every child in our Darlington Street Nursery, Reception, Year 1, Year 6 and if all of our projected key worker and other identified children attended school on Monday 8th June, then we can group our children into the following smaller groups:

Darlington Street Nursery: no more than **9 children** per group/area of school (if all children attended their session);

Reception children: no more than 12 children per group/area of school;

Year 1: no more than 12 children per group/classroom;

Year 6: no more than **10 children** per group/classroom;

Key worker and other identified children: no more than 14 children per group/classroom;

- *Regular hand washing in small groups will take place throughout the day;
- *A staggered approach to play time and lunch time will help us minimise the amount of children in any particular area at one time;
- *Until we are advised it is safe enough to bring larger groups of children together, Collective Worship will take place in small groups.

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We are asking parents/carers of children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 to contact the school office by **12pm on Wednesday**3rd June to let us know if your child/ren <u>will or will not</u> be attending nursery/school from Monday 8th June 2020.

If you decide not to send your child into school on Monday 8th June, but then your circumstances change and you would like them to start back at school, you can contact the school office to arrange this

As we have seen over the last few weeks, plans can change at any given moment and so please keep us up to date with relevant contact details so that we can keep you fully informed.

Over the next few weeks, we will be looking to see what events we can safely plan to take place in school. Already, many 'special' events have been cancelled. Given the timing of some events and their 'uniqueness' in the life of a child, the following events are ones that **we will look closely at** as a governing body and staff to see if we feel they could still take place on a different date, in some amended format that would be safe for all involved:
