<u>Bikeability</u> – Some children from Year 6 recently took part in some Bikeability session on our school site and within the local community. Children learned how to cycle safely on the road including signalling, positioning and completing safety checks on their bikes. <u>Black History Month Celebrations</u> – Children in Y1 – Y6 have been busy celebrating October's Black History Month. To launch this, the children took part in an African drumming workshop last Wednesday led by Mr Robert Maseko and Mrs Winnie Kibula. The day started with a Whole



School Worship and involved lots of music and dancing. Returning to the hall at the end of the day, each year group performed to each other and enjoyed finding more out about African history and culture. Children have also been learning about inspirational figures in their classes to foster an understanding of black history. They have today presented their learning to each other in a celebratory Black History Month Worship.



<u>Eco-Schools Conference</u> – Some members of our School Eco-Council attended the Wigan Borough Eco-Schools conference at Central Park Academy in Wigan last week. The day began with the children meeting the Mayor of Wigan, Councillor Stephen Dawber. The children spoke with representatives from local and national companies to find out how we can make changes in school and in our personal lives to have a positive impact on our

environment. They then attended an air pollution workshop, where they made pledges to tackle the air pollution near school. After a spot of lunch, the children received a message from Hacker the dog from CBBC who told them to keep up the good work.

<u>Choir Performances</u> – Many thanks to our school choir who performed for all our children and visitors earlier this week. Our next school choir performance in school will be at 9:05am on Wednesday 11th December. As well as regular performances in school, we take part in lots of community events with our choir. <u>Secondary School applications</u> – For the parents/carers of children in Year 6, do not forget to complete your child's application for Secondary School by the closing date of **Thursday 31**st **October**. The children have recently visited our local high school for a taster session and there have been open evenings for you to attend. You will be notified in March next year of the name of the Secondary School that your child will be going to.

<u>Remembrance Sunday parade</u> – Upon our return to school after half term, letters will be sent out asking for children to take part in the annual Remembrance Sunday parade on Sunday 10th November. Nursery - Children will come into the school hall and perform some Christmas songs on stage to nursery families only. All visitors who have come to watch will then have the opportunity to go into nursery to spend time with their child for a short stay and play session. This will be repeated the following day. However, as nursery may get rather busy, we would ask that you only attend one of the stay and play sessions. We are still finalising plans for our Lancaster Avenue performances - Ms Naughton will update you when we have confirmed arrangements.

<u>Reception</u> – Children will take to the stage to perform their Christmas production, in the school hall, to their families only.

KS1 – All children in Year 1 and Year 2 will perform together, on stage as in previous years.
