# Important days

**Monday** - Spellings homework is handed out and spellings are tested on Friday. Children can access the edshed website for activities linked to their spellings.

**Thursday/Friday** - PE - Children must have an appropriate indoor PE kit in school and attend school wearing their outdoor PE kit on Thursday.

Reading books are to be returned on Friday and new books will be issued on Monday. Children should access Reading Plus from home alongside their reading book. Reading should be completed at least 3 times per week.

# Reading

As part of our reading policy, children should read at least 3 times each week.

Team points will be given as a reward for home reading.

Children may be awarded a weekly class reading champion medal for showing improvements in reading.

# Expectations

- As juniors we take effort and presentation very seriously. It is expected that all children will try their best at EVERY piece of work that they are given to complete. If this is not the case, children will be asked to complete work again in their own time.

# What can you do?

- Reading at home with your child is a fundamental part of their learning and should be done regularly to help your child to reach their potential.
- Encouraging your child to do any homework given and assisting where necessary without 'doing it for them'. All homework given will follow on from work that has been done in class. It is important that your child tries this for themselves and that any mistakes are evident for the teacher to see.
