country	A nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory.	
continent	Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).	☐ There are seven continents: Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America and South America.
capital city	The city or town that functions as the seat of government and administrative centre of a country or region.	The surface of the planet is approximately 71% water and contains five oceans: the Arctic, Atlantic, Indian, Pacific and Souther n. The Arctic Ocean is the smallest of the world's five ocean basins. A polar bear walks on the frozen surface of the Arctic Ocean.
sea	The expanse of salt water that covers most of the earth's surface and surrounds its land masses.	
ocean	A very large expanse of sea, in particular each of the main areas into which the sea is divided geographically	A compass is used for navigation, location and direction. The compass greatly improved the safety of travel.
