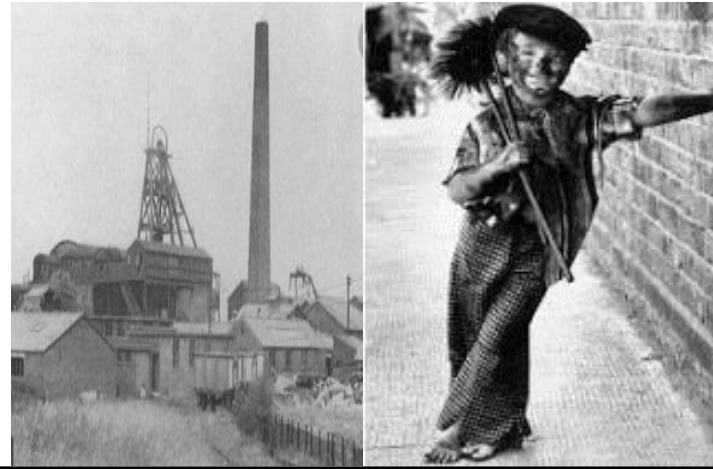


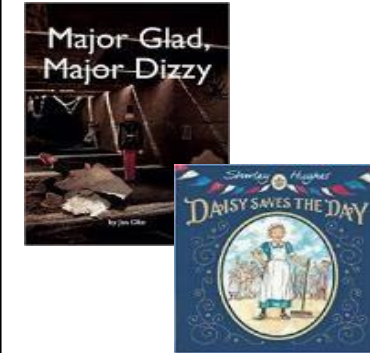
# What happened in Tyldesley in the past?

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

<b>mining</b>	When minerals and metals are removed from the earth.
<b>coal</b>	A black rock that is found underground.
<b>colliery</b>	A coal mine and the buildings and equipment associated with it.
<b>pit</b>	A large hole in the ground.
<b>factory</b>	A place where products are manufactured.
<b>cotton mill</b>	A factory used for producing cotton, fabrics, thread etc.
<b>landmark</b>	Something that is easy to see and can help a person find their way to a place near it. It can also be a building of historical importance.
<b>farthing</b>	A farthing was a coin. It was worth a quarter of an old penny. Four farthings made an old penny.
<b>charabanc</b>	A type of horse-drawn vehicle or early motor coach, usually open topped.

## Sticky Knowledge about Tyldesley in the past

- In the 19<sup>th</sup> century and early 20<sup>th</sup> century, Tyldesley was known for textiles and coal mining. These industries provided jobs for many people.
- Coal mining was a very important industry in Tyldesley. The town was surrounded by collieries for more than 100 years until after World War II.
- About 100 years ago most children would have been working in a full-time job by the time they were 12 years old.
- There were no televisions or electronic games 100 years ago. There were very few books as well and very few poor children would know how to read.
- Tyldesley looks very different today but it is still a bustling market town with a market square.
