CURRICULUM CONTEXT

In order to maintain and improve progress and attainment of all children, our curriculum has been designed to reflect the need for cultural capital, key vocabulary, reading and knowledge development. When designing our curriculum, consideration was given to our: school context, school vision, school inspiration and school values in order to ensure our provision meets the needs of our children both for now and for their future.

School Context:

St. George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery is an above average sized Voluntary Aided School with nursery provision for 3/4 year olds on the school based site and provision for both 2 and 3 year olds on our Lancaster Avenue Nursery site (acquired in August 2016, under section 27). We have 11 classes and our standard admission number increased from 40 to 45 in each year group in Sept 2018. As a result, some children are taught in mixed aged classes. In Sept 2016, we admitted 'overpan', in Reception (50 children) and moved to having 2 distinct Rec classes. Some learners are taught in mixed year group classes – this starts in Year 1 and is organised throughout school based on age.

^{*}The % of SEND children has fallen since January 2017 and is currently broadly in line with Local Authority and National.

^{*}Our NOR has increased by **36 pupils** since January 2015.

^{*}We have rising numbers in both our nursery settings which should result in our NOR continuing to rise.
