Community	A well-defined area, such as a town or area of a town, where people live together under one government.
Diversity	A variety. For example, people from different backgrounds.
Clubs	Relating to dental care
Members	People who belong to a particular group.
Outsiders	People who does not belong to a particular group.
Welcome	To respond to the arrival of with pleasure and hospitality.
Migrant	Someone who moves from one place to another, sometimes to improve their living conditions or work prospects.
Asylum Seeker	An individual who is seeking international protection.
Refugee	Someone who has left their country of origin for reasons of feared persecution, conflict or other circumstances that have seriously disturbed public order and, as a result, they require international protection.

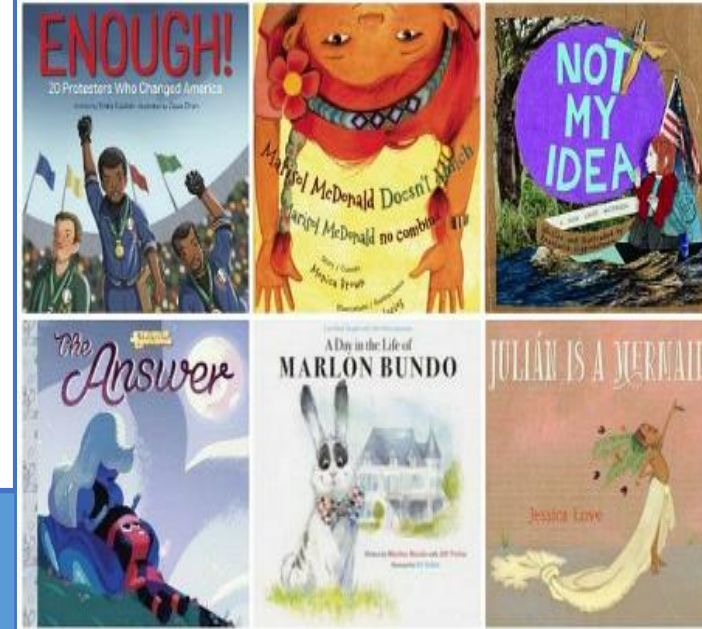
What makes a community?
