Subject Specific Vocabulary

Career	The job or profession that someone does for a long period of their life
Wage	An amount of money that is regularly paid to an individual for the work that they do.
Voluntary work	This is work done by people who are not paid for it, but who do it because they want to do it.
Attribute	A quality or feature that someone or something has.
Qualifications	A special skill or type of experience or knowledge that makes someone suitable to do a particular job or activity.
Apprenticeship	An arrangement in which someone learns an art, trade, or job under another.
Discrimination	Treating someone or a group of people differently, in a worse way because of their characteristics. For example, excluding them from a group.



What job would I like in the future?
