sin	The transgression or breaking of the Law of God.
The Golden Rule	Found in the Gospel Matthew, to love thy neighbour and do to others as you would have them do to you.
tikkun olam	The Hebrew phrase which means 'world repair'.
Harold Moody	Doctor, civil rights campaigner and Christian who served in the name of God despite racism and exclusion.
proverb	A traditional saying or phrase that expresses a perceived truth.
Ten Commandments	The ten rules given to Moses by God that dictate how humans should interact with one another.
Judaism	A religion developed amongst ancient Hebrews.
Christianity	The religion based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ.
