

Y3/4 What is the Trinity and why is it important to Christians?

Key Vocabulary	
Trinity	Third person of the Trinity who guides Christians through life.
God	Thought of by Christians as the ruler and creator of our universe.
Jesus	The son of God.
Holy Spirit	The Christian belief that the one God can be present in the three persons of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
Gospel	The record of Christ's life and teaching in the first four books of the New Testament.
symbolic	A common object or thing that represents something of importance.
baptism	A Christian sacrament which symbolises a person entering the Christian community.

<p>Prior learning: Pupils will have learnt that stories about Jesus come from the Gospels.</p>
<p>Future Learning: Pupils will learn about key features of a Gospel. Pupils will learn about how being 'holy' and 'loving' allows Christians to relate to the Holy Trinity.</p>
