

# Y3/4 For Christians what was the impact of Pentecost?

Key Vocabulary	
<b>Ascension</b>	Festival to celebrate Jesus returning to heaven forty days after his resurrection.
<b>Pentecost</b>	The Christian festival to celebrate the Holy Spirit coming to guide the disciples after Jesus ascended to heaven.
<b>Trinity</b>	Third person of the Trinity who guides Christians through life.
<b>Holy Spirit</b>	The Christian belief that the one God can be present in the three persons of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
<b>inspiration</b>	The process of being stimulated to do something creative.
<b>church</b>	A building for Christian worship, or the whole congregation of believers.
<b>mission</b>	A vocation or calling to do a particular job.
<b>Saul/Paul</b>	Met Jesus on the Damascus road and accepted the mission to spread Christianity to the gentiles.
