

Y5/6: What do Christians believe Jesus did to save people?

Key Vocabulary	
The Big Story	Read from Genesis to Revelation, the Bible telling us about the reign and rule of God.
Incarnation	The belief that God in Christ is active in the Church and the world.
Salvation	The saving of human beings from sin and its consequences.
sacrifice	Jesus' offering of his own life to ensure Christians' sins are forgiven.
Holy Communion	The service at Christian worship at which bread and wine are shared. The bread represents the body and the wine represents the blood that Jesus sacrificed for Christians.
Holy Week	The last week Jesus spent in Jerusalem, starting on Palm Sunday until Easter Sunday.
Garden of Gethsemane	The garden outside of Jerusalem which saw Judas' betrayal and Jesus' arrest.

Prior learning

- Pupils will have learnt that Jesus' sacrifice saved Christians from their previous sins.
- Pupils will have learnt about Holy Week and the reason that Good Friday is thought of as 'good'.
