Judaism	The religion developed among ancient Hebrews.
The Torah	In Judaism, the law of God as revealed to Moses and recorded in the first five books of the Hebrew scriptures.
Sin	An immoral act considered to be a transgression against divine law.
Exodus	The departure of the Israelites from Egypt.
Rosh Hashanah	The Jewish New Year festival held in September.
Yom Kippur	The Day of Atonement in Judaism. The holiday's purpose is to purify an individual and community.
Passover	The major Jewish spring festival which commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from Egyptian slavery, lasting seven or eight days

Prior learning:
