

Why do Christians celebrate the Eucharist?

Key Vocabulary

Eucharist	A Christian service which symbolises the body and blood of Christ.
Holy Communion	The service of Christian worship at which bread and wine are blessed and shared.
Last Supper	The final meal which Jesus shared with his apostles before his betrayal and arrest.
Remembrance	The action of remembering someone or something.
Holy	Something regarded as worthy of complete devotion and trust.
Sacrifice	The act of giving up something costly to yourself for the good of others or your beloved.
Sacrament	A religious practice or ritual that is an outward sign of an internal faith.
Faith	A complete trust or confidence in something or someone.
Mercy	A compassionate gift given to someone who is suffering.
Salvation	The act of saving or being saved from sin or evil.
