Key Vocabulary	
Samuel	Regarded as a prophet by Jews, Christians and Muslims. He guided the people of God from the time of the judges into the time of the kings.
David	Third king of the united kingdoms of Israel and Judah. Credited with writing the Psalms.
Jonathon	Son of King Saul and friend of David.
Goliath	Philistine champion warrior from Gath defeated by the boy David.
Saul	First king of the united kingdoms replaced when he abandoned God.
inspiration	An unconscious burst of creativity in an artistic pursuit such as poetry.
Psalm	Sacred poems or sung comprising a book in the Old Testament.

Prior learning

- Pupils will have studied the type of books found in the Bible and be familiar with the Old and New Testaments.
- Pupils will have studied the creation story and may know some of the Psalms from their unit on peace.

Future Learning

- Pupils will study how women are presented in the Old Testament
