

Y5/6 How and Why do Christians read the Bible?

How important are holy books in faiths other than Christianity?

Key Vocabulary	
Old Testament	First 39 books of the Christian Bible that correspond to the Hebrew scriptures.
New Testament	Last 27 books of the Christian Bible that cover the life and teachings of Jesus and his first followers.
Gospel	Meaning "good news" on of the 4 books that contain stories of the life of Jesus: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
Word of God	How believers view the Bible.
translation	A version of one text transposed into another language.
Quran	The muslim scriptures revealed to the Prophet Mohammed by the Angel Gabriel between 610AD and 632AD.
