What will we learn:

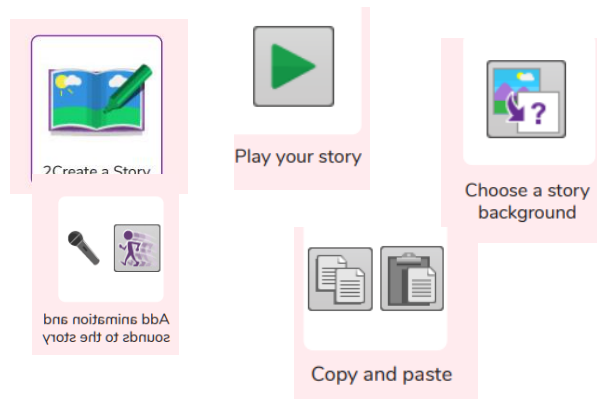
- To add animation to a story

Animation	Process of giving the illusion of movement to drawings and models
Font	The style of text used in a piece of writing on the computer or tablet.
Sound Effect	A sound other than speech or music made for use in a play, film or computer file.
E Book	A book that can be read on the computer or on a tablet.
File	A piece of work on the computer.

### Fun Facts:

- An animated story is a story where the images in the foreground can move in a variety of ways.
- Walt Disney had only two animators working for him when he created Steamboat Willie in 1928.
- Production of *Beauty and the Beast* took more than 3 years and required the talents of nearly 600 animators, artists, and technicians.
- The word "animation" stems from the Latin "animātiōn", stem of "animātiō", meaning "a bestowing of life"
