Key Words	Definition	Key Skills
Variation	Changing a motif or phrase to differ slightly from the original.	Creativity – more opportunity should be given for children to create their own routine/ style and music. Different groups may want to use Ipads to choose different music tracks.
Improvisation	The spontaneous creation of dance movements.	Comparing performances – peer and self-review should be used throughout the topic. The use of Ipads is a great way to film, watch back, critique and improve dances.
Section	A larger chunk of a routine which may be selected and worked upon.	Improvisation – Children should be given some time to make their own movement to a beat. This may be to music or simply to the beat of a tambourine or drum.
Choreography	The sequence of movements in dance and the art of creating such.	Coaching Points
Choreographic Device	How the dance is performed, including unison, cannon, call and response or repetition.	Specificity – children may focus on specific styles of dance (such as the Haka/ pavane) and will need to learn the style and language relating to these.
Stimulus	The impetus for creating movement. This may be an image, equipment or music.	Groups – children should get the opportunity to learn and create dances both individually and in groups. This is a good opportunity for higher ability dancers to lead their team.
Contemporary	A style of dance focusing on experimentation and creativity.	Task – some children may struggle to remember a routine. Build in easier movements, longer movements or more repetition to support them.



Unit 2

In the second unit of dance within Year 5 and 6, the children should be given more freedom to choose the style and music that they want.

Different groups may work on different pieces of music/ styles of dance.
