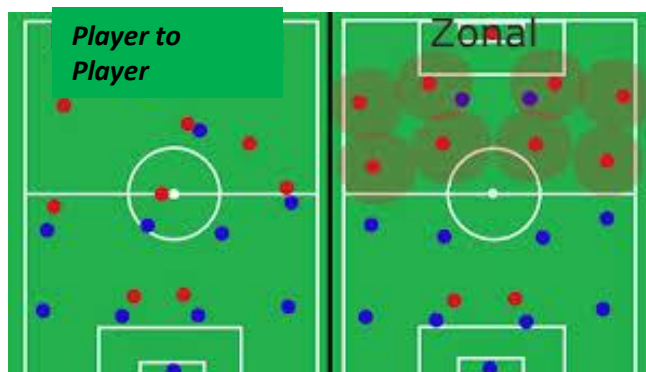

Key Words	Definition	Key Skills
Tactics	Plans and ideas required in a game to try and achieve the best possible outcome	Tackling - Children should be able to gain possession of the ball from the opposition, timing the tackle carefully.
Awareness	Developing an understanding of what is around to help make decisions	Communication – Children should be encouraged to talk to one another and support each other, working against the opposition team.
Overload	To pack an area of the pitch with payers to try and gain an advantage	Awareness – Though priority should be given to honing particular skills, children should begin to develop an awareness of what is around to find a pass, find space or avoid defenders.
Cover	Providing support to a team mate by backing them up if they make a mistake	Interception – If reading the game well, children should be able to predict where an opponent is aiming to put the ball and get there first.
Marking	A defensive strategy which aims to prevent opposition players receiving the ball	Coaching Points
Clearance	To remove the ball from danger by putting it into a safer area	STEP – Differentiation can be achieved by reducing/ enlarging the space, altering the target in a task, using easier equipment overloading attackers or defenders.
Teamwork	Working together to achieve the best outcome for the team	Decision making – to challenge children , get them to discuss why they have made certain decisions, whether they think they were correct and what they would do next time.
