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Feedback from Key Stage 1 children about Science (November 2023)

General questions about Science

Children from Nursery, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 have feedback on Science. Some of the questions asked may have been slightly re-worded so they were accessible to children of all ages

What is Science about?

- *Finding out about animals and creatures.
- *Learning about plants.
- *Learning about trees.
- *Learning about the environment.

Why is Science important?

- *To learn new facts.
- *To get a job using science.
- *You could become a scientist.

Tell me about your favourite piece of work in Science and tell me why you enjoyed learning about this.

- *Sorting domestic and wild animals. Fish can be pets but they can also live in the wild.
- *Comparing what is the same and what is different about groups of animals. I learned all mammals have legs but they have different diets.
- *Sort animals into their different groups. I learned that snakes are reptiles.

How do you know if you are doing well in Science?

- *It might say well done in our book.
- *We get team points.
- *We might show our work to a different class.

What happens if you are finding work difficult in Science?

- * Ask the teacher for help.
- *Ask a friend for help.

What do you need to do to improve your learning in Science?

*Read some books about animals.

In September, you completed some work on different groups of animals in Science, what can you tell me about it?

- *Frogs are amphibians.
- *A robin is a bird.
- *A human is mammal.
- *A lizard and a snake are reptiles.

Can you explain what some of this Science vocabulary means?

- *Fish it has gills, it breathes underwater, they have fins and scaly skin.
- *Amphibian first they breathe underwater and then they breathe on land.
- *Bird they have feathers, some can't fly, they've got wings and a beak. They eat fish and worms.
- *Reptile they have scaly skin.
- *Mammal humans, bears and cows. They have fur or hair.
- *Herbivore it eats plants.
- *Carnivore it eats meat.
- *Omnivore it eats plants and meet.

Can you think where this learning link to things that you have learned before in Science with a different teacher?

*Learning about your body.

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Subject specific questions about Science

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Can you think about a Science investigation you have carried out, what can you tell me about it?

*N/A to the topic

What do you think would happen if all animals were omnivores?

- *Plants would become extinct quickly.
- *There wouldn't be as much oxygen from trees.
- *There wouldn't be enough food.

Action to take as a result of Pupil Feedback on Science

*Use mini refreshers to ensure children have an understanding of what reptiles are.
