REMOTE HOME LEARNING PROVISION

Introduction

Our Remote Learning Provision offer only applies to those who are well enough to attend school but cannot gain access to school site due to COVID-19 related issues. This may take the form of individual children who are awaiting a COVID-19 test/awaiting COVID-19 test results or in self-isolation due to family members. If this is the case for your child, we ask that you contact our school office by phone or email so that we are aware of the nature of your child's absence at the earliest opportunity. It may also be the case that a whole class or group of children may be absent from school for an extended period of self-isolation. Within this document, we aim to show you our provision offer in the event of self-isolation of individuals, groups or if there was a national or local lockdown in place for schools.

Accessibility to Remote Learning Provision



In order to improve our offer as a school, we have recently subscribed to the online platform 'Seesaw'. Further information regarding the use of Seesaw has been sent out to parents/carers. We will be developing the use of this resource and feel that this will improve our Remote Learning offer as teachers will be able to communicate with parents/carers in order to ensure that the learning needs of your children are being met whilst accessing learning remotely. There is also a facility within this platform for staff to pre-record and upload teaching resources so that children are able to listen to, or watch, their teacher. This could support children in undertaking their learning more independently whilst isolating. We realise that not everyone will have access to Wi-Fi and/or devices and we are looking to make use of government grants in order to ensure that equipment is available for everyone during periods of self-isolation or lockdown. Paper copies of work can be made available upon request if there is no online access at the time of self-isolation or lockdown.

Provision during individual or whole class self-isolation or lockdown

Our school approach

All children will have access to 'Seesaw' and other online resources to support home learning during periods of self-isolation or lockdown. Some lessons and activities will be completed using these online learning platforms however, due to the nature of the curriculum across school, many activities will be practical and 'hands on' (especially in Early Years). Unless requested, all remote home learning activities will be communicated to you via 'Seesaw' on a daily basis. Our aim, during an extended period of self-isolation, is to have all learning opportunities for the day communicated to parents/carers for our 8:55am start time and any paper copies dropped at households for 9:30am. For individual cases of self-isolation, arrangements for remote learning will be made via an initial telephone call from the class teacher. Throughout the day, parents/carers can then upload photographs and/or videos of any completed work or of children undertaking any practical activities to 'Seesaw'. Written/typed responses from children may also be uploaded through 'Seesaw'. Teachers will be able to provide feedback based on the work uploaded to 'Seesaw'.
