At 8am each day, our caretaker, Mr Kieran, will place our 'Pavement Signs' on the zig-zag lines on the Peel Hall side of Darlington Street. This will ensure all children, including those attending breakfast and after school clubs, will be able to cross the road safely. We recommend anyone travelling by car to avoid the street entirely.
