Three stars and a wish - Our annual 'three stars and a wish' questionnaire is being sent out today to all members of the St. George's Central community. This process involves you telling me three things you think the school does well and one thing that that we might improve. Hopefully some of your 'wishes' from last year were granted over the last ten months and we hope that by completing the questionnaire again this year, we can work together to continually

improve our school. I would be grateful if you could complete and return this to school by Friday 7th July to enable me to collate the responses over the summer holiday.

Staffing updates – I would also like to take this opportunity to formally announce that at the end of this academic year Mrs Fudge will be leaving our school. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Fudge for all her hard work during her time at our school in her role as SENCO and KS2 leader. We are currently in the process of appointing a new teacher for KS2 and re-organising our staffing ready for September. As a result we will communicate our full and complete class teacher list in our next newsletter on Monday 17th July.



Building work - For the past ten months I have been meeting with Wigan Council in order to plan how we can extend and renovate part of our school. I am pleased to inform you that at our most recent meeting, plans were approved and we were given a time scale for work to start and be completed. Work that we have secured funding for includes:

*Re-modelling of KS2 resource area to include a small group room and cloakroom space outside each classroom, and

*An extension to the building which will include 3 rooms: a room that could accommodate the teaching of approximate 16 children, a small group room and an adult meeting room.

The extension will be built on the 'Peel Hall' side of school (it will be built where the large green storage currently is). This container will be removed so that work can start. The builders are aiming to start work to school as we break for the summer holidays and it hoped that the whole project will be completed by February 2018. In order to make a brisk start, it is hoped that some of the materials and supplies will be dropped off at school during the last week of term (wb: Monday 17th July). Therefore, from this point onwards, this access point to school will be totally out of use until the work is fully completed. This will mean that anyone accessing the playground will need to use the path near nursery (the gate here will be made wider).


When we return to school in September, we will be in a better position to inform you of the exact classroom access points for your children and of course our fire safety procedures will be updated to ensure everyone's safety during the work. I am sure that you will agree that this is an exciting opportunity for our school and your children.

KS2 END OF YEAR PRODUCTION



Not long to go before the KS2 production takes place here in school. The table below outlines the dates of key events concerned with the performance. We anticipate that all the children in Y3/4/5 will support these performances, a letter has been sent home about this – many thanks for those who have already returned their letter (all letters to be handed in by Friday 30th June). There will be two performances in total, but only *one* evening performance (Wednesday 12th July - 6pm). All Key Stage 2 children who attend this <u>evening performance</u> of the play will be entitled to a FREE SCHOOL DISCO (see Disco section of this newsletter for further details). As space in

our school hall is at a premium, and as the KS1 and nursery children will have seen the dress rehearsal, should you need to bring any younger children (including children from St. George's Central nursery, reception and KS1) then they will need to access our crèche facility. This will mean that there are more tickets available for older family members.

<u>PSHE activities</u> – School was recently visited by the NSPCC who not only led our whole school worship but then carried out some further work in Year 5 and Year 6 about *'staying safe and speaking out'*. This week, our Year 6 children visited the Pelican Centre to undertake some First Aid 'training' and next week our Year 5 children will be visiting the Life Centre in Wigan to participate in sessions covering topics including road safety, crossing roads

safely, basic first aid, recycling and litter, stranger danger and healthy lifestyles. These sessions are run by representatives from the NHS, Wigan Council and GM Police.


<u>KS1 trip</u> – Children in KS1 are really looking forward to their trip to Blackpool Sea Life Centre on **Thursday 29th June**. They will learn about different types of sea creatures and will be able to look closely at some of the creatures during talks from members of staff. The children will also get some time to explore the beach at Blackpool and this will help to support our topic about the seaside.



<u>Y6 transition</u> – Our Year 6 children have recently been working on a transition project with one of our local high schools. The children have been working with Mrs Walters and Mr Maloney from FLHS, learning how to develop their presentation skills. The children are going to spend the next few weeks producing their presentations which

will be about themselves and their time at our school. This will not only provide the children will the opportunity to develop their presentation skills but will also allow them to reflect upon their learning at our school as they move onto high school.

Music Gala Concert – Our Year 5 children have been invited to participate in a Music Gala concert at Robin Park on Tuesday 4th July. The children will be part of a mass performance of a specially commissioned piece of music called 'Let's Dance' for which the children will learn a song and create percussion using their bodies. The children have already taken part in a workshop in school to prepare for this.

Sports days – As sent out in the previous newsletter, the dates for these are as follows:

Monday 26th June – Key Stage 2 (9:30am start on the school field) Tuesday 27th June – Reception and Key Stage 1 (9:30am start on the school field and playground) Wednesday 28th June – Nursery (9:30am start on the school field)

You are very welcome to attend these events and in most cases you will be able to follow your child/ren to each station.

Nursery Worship – At 9:15am on Friday 30th June, our Nursery children will come together for their Class Worship in our school hall. On this day, all parents/carers and wider family members of the nursery children are invited to attend as the children showcase their learning, and you will be invited to remain in school for a 'stay and play' session following the Worship, should you wish. On the day, please enter school via the main school entrance.



Drumming performance – There will be a performance for parents and carers on Thursday 13th July by the children in Y4 who have been undertaking drumming sessions as part of the Wider Opportunities service we buy into. This will start at 1:45pm in the school hall and will last approximately 30 minutes it will provide you with an opportunity to see the children perform for the final time this year.

School books - As you know from our last newsletter, for this last half term, all children have started their new school books that they will take with them to their new class in September. We will therefore be sending your child's school books (September 2016 – May 2017) home on Friday 14th July. We are required to keep a sample of

books as evidence of work completed in previous academic years. Therefore a small number of children will not bring some of their books home this time. If this is the case for your child, please call into school to have a look at them. They will be given them to keep at the end of next year.



Annual Reports – Your child's annual school report will be sent home on Friday 14th July. Our report format has again been slightly amended this year and, because of the national tests some children undertake, there are some subtle differences with some year groups. We have included a key to explain each element of the report and there is a section where the children assess their own level of effort. As usual with our reports, there is an opportunity

for you to comment and let us know any thoughts and feedback on the year as a whole. Please ensure that you return any completed forms to me at school by Wednesday 19th July.

This year we are again providing you with an opportunity to speak to your child's class teacher about their report, should you wish. All the teachers will therefore be in the school hall on Monday 17th July (3:30pm – 6:00pm). No appointment is necessary for this, however, as we will not know how many people will be coming, please be aware that we may need to limit the time you spend with your child's teacher – we will simply have to judge this on the night! As Y6 are at Alton Towers on this day, any parents/carers wishing to speak to their teacher will need to make a separate appointment.

<u>Talent show</u> – During the afternoon of Thursday 20^{th} July there will be a talent show in school which will involve all classes. Because of the timings over the afternoon, each class will have a limit of 2/3 performances and so classes will be voting on the talents that will represent them. Due to restrictions on space in the hall, we are unable to invite parents/carers to watch.
