Staffing update – I am pleased to announce that we have recently appointed Miss N Leonard as a KS2 teacher from September. This will be Miss Leonard's first teaching position and she has already been in school to work alongside staff to ensure that she has things ready for starting in September. Recent amendments in our staffing provided us with an opportunity to re-structure our senior leadership team in school. I am therefore also pleased to announce that Mrs O'Brien and Mr Young were recently successfully appointed as Assistant Headteachers. Mrs O'Brien will be responsible for Inclusion (SEND) and Mr Young will focus on curriculum and the teaching and learning throughout school. I am sure you will wish all three teachers luck as they start their new roles for September.

KS1 and KS2 Snack – Many thanks to all the people who returned feedback on our snack provision in school for children in KS1 and KS2. This helped inform our decision making in this area. From September, there will be four snack options for all KS1 and KS2 children: *Milk *Toast *Milk and toast *Fresh fruit from home

The only acceptable option that can be brought into school by children from home is a piece of fresh fruit (and their usual plain water in their water bottle). Please note: no variety of any cereal bars or fruit drinks will be allowed from September 2017 onwards. We are also amended the payment options for snack payments. It will now need to be paid half termly in advance. Within the envelope your child will come home with today detailing their class, will be a letter providing you with further information about this.

PE kits – Many thanks again for all the people who replied to our consultation about children coming to school wearing the new school PE kit on the day they have PE. On this occasion, we have decided against implementing this approach. With your feedback, we have however decided that from September onwards, for children in Y1 – Y6 we will adopt the school hoody and jogging trousers, dark leggings or school shorts for outdoor PE lessons (modelled by Lyra on the picture) with the usual school t-shirt underneath. For indoor PE lessons, we will keep the school/dark shorts and t-shirt (modelled by Oliver). These PE kits are available at Wendy's in Tyldesley and Icon Embroidery in Astley.

<u>Whole school rewards</u> – Our School Council have been working hard to 're-vamp' our whole school reward system and we are looking to have the new system and display in place for September. The basic principles with our new system are that:

*Children will be in one of four teams throughout school (named after the four Gospel Saints – St Matthew, St Mark, St Luke and St John);

*Y6 team captains will be appointed;

*Children will earn team points as rewards for work in class/behaviour around school and add these onto their class display;

*Points will be added up each week and the team with the most points that week will win the team points trophy and move along one space on our new display, which will be in the school hall.

We wanted to use an idea based within our locality for the display and the School Council came up with the idea of each team travelling along the guided busway from Manchester to Tyldesley, visiting different places along the way. The team who are the closest to Tyldesley at the end of the year would be the winners and enjoy a team treat.

<u>Crucial Crew</u> – Tuesday 27th June saw all of Year 5 attend a 'Crucial Crew' event at Wigan Life Centre. The children went there for the afternoon and learned many life skills. They took part in some mini-workshops including: Emergency First Aid, stranger danger, road safety, healthy living and recycling.





KS1 Blackpool trip – On Thursday 29th June, the whole of KS1 set off of a trip to Blackpool. First stop was the Sea Life Centre where the children saw lots of different sea creatures and were even able to handle some star fish and crabs! The children also met Boris who was half shark and half stingray. Later the children enjoyed going on the beach and pier and sampled a delicious ice cream! The trip really helped to support the children's learning as part of their current topic. Thank you to all our volunteers that made the trip possible also!

<u>Y6 Learning Review project</u> – Over the last few weeks, our Year 6 children have been developing their presentation skills as part of a learning review project with Fred Longworth High School. Mrs Walters, from the high school, had visited the children a few weeks ago to give them hints and tips on what makes an effective presentation. The children then spent the next few weeks putting together their presentation, about themselves and their learning at our school. Mrs Walters then returned to join Mr Young and Mrs Morris to watch the children successfully showcase their learning.





<u>Music Gala Concert</u> – Tuesday 4th July saw our Y5 children visit Robin Park for the Wigan Music Service's Singing Gala. The children were treated to several pieces performed by the Wigan Youth Orchestra, before performing as part of a multi-school choir to the song 'Let's Dance'. Two of our children were selected to have a performance poem published as part of an anthology that was handed out to each attending school.

It was an extremely enjoyable and inspiring afternoon for our children!

<u>Summer Song Share</u> – On Wednesday 5th July, our Y2 attended Robin Park Arena to take part in the KS1 Summer Song Share. It was the first time our school had taken part in this event. Lots of other schools were there and we sang two songs with them altogether. Also our children joined others on stage to perform our song (Toes a Twinklin').
