World Cup Celebrations – We hit the ground running with our World Cup celebrations which started on the first day back after half term as the 'Pop Project' returned to school. The children listened and watched as the musicians performed popular songs and also provided the children with information about the culture and lifestyle of the times. They supplement the music with pictures, video clips and artefacts from different World Cups to make the experience truly interactive and it was a great way to start our World Cup celebrations! Our celebrations then continued the week after as each class studied a different country and presented their learning to the rest of the school in a sharing assembly. Children also took part in a penalty shoot-out competition and a competition to design a football kit. Thanks to Miss Glassbrook and Mr Simmons for organising our World Cup events in school.

ATHOS music concert – On Thursday 7th June, our school choir took part in the first ever ATHOS Music Festival at St. Stephen's Church. This event involved the children performing alongside other local schools. The children from our school performed the traditional African song 'Nanuma', 'Sun Rise' and 'Heal the World' by Michael Jackson and they later participated in a shared song with the other schools.



Y6 London residential – Some of our Y6 children recently experienced a two day residential visit to London. The trip involved the children visiting the Tower of London, having an evening meal at Planet Hollywood, seeing a West End Show, experiencing the London Dungeon and having a boat trip on the Thames. Many thanks to Mrs Feeney, Mrs Malley and Mr Young who accompanied the children on the trip.

Y6 leavers' service – Thursday 14th June saw our Y6 children attend a leavers' service at Manchester Cathedral. This service is held annually and involves all the Y6 children from across the Manchester Diocese. This year, children from our school were asked to do a presentation at this service on the theme of Peace and as always represented our school well.



Trips and visitors – Earlier this week our Year 5 children visited the Life Centre in Wigan to participate in sessions covering topics including road safety, crossing roads safely, basic first aid, recycling and litter, stranger danger and healthy lifestyles. These sessions were run by representatives from the NHS, Wigan Council and GM Police. Next week, children in KS1 will all visit the Maritime Museum in Liverpool and Wigan Athletic will be in school to deliver The Healthy Heart Project with Y5 and Y6 children.





Please let our school office know if you will need to make use of the crèche so that we can make the necessary staff arrangements.


This will mean that there are more tickets available for older family members.

We have again liaised with an external provider and they will be filming some of the rehearsals and the final performance of the play so that we can provide the Y6 leavers with a full copy of the play as a leavers' gift. Should this be of particular concern for you then please let the school office know by Friday 29th June so that seating provision for your child can be made.

Please note that our last week of after school clubs is week beginning Monday 2nd July, which will mean that after Friday 6th July there will be no after school clubs until September.

Let's Sing Concert – On **Tuesday 10th July**, Miss Gray will be taking our school choir to the Let's Sing Concert at Robin Park Indoor Sports Centre in Wigan. The children will sing a variety of songs alongside children from other schools. The organiser of this event, Mr Orrell, has been in school to rehearse with our children and Miss Gray has been using time after school with our choir to ensure that they know all the words to all the songs. I am sure it will be a fantastic event as usual.



Talent show – During the afternoon of **Friday 13th July** there will be a talent show in school which will involve all classes. Because of the timings over the afternoon, each class will have a limit of 2/3 performances and so classes will be voting on the talents that will represent them. Due to restrictions on space in the hall, we are unable to invite parents/carers to watch.

Annual Reports and School books – As you know from our last newsletter, for this last half term, all children have started their new school books that they will take with them to their new class in September. We will therefore be sending your child's school books (June 2017 – May 2018) home on **Friday 13th July**. We are required to keep a sample of books as evidence of work completed in previous academic years. Therefore a small number of children will not bring some of their books home this time. If this is the case for your child, please call into school to have a look at them. They will be given them to keep at the end of next year. Your child's annual school report will be sent home on **Friday 13th July**. We have included a key to explain each element of the report and there is a section where the children assess their own level of effort. As usual with our reports, there is an opportunity for you to comment and let us know any thoughts and feedback on the year as a whole. Please ensure that you return any completed forms to me at school by **Wednesday 18th July**.
