
Nursery and Reception – It is great to see and hear about how our Nursery and Reception children have settled into life at our school. The children have been interacting well with each other, making new friends, learning the new routines and enjoying a variety of learning experiences. We would also like to thank all parents/carers for your support with our home visits and by filling in the ages and stages questionnaire.



Target booklets – If your child is in Y1 – Y6 then you will have received your copy of their Autumn Term target booklet last Friday. Nursery and Reception children will be bringing theirs home today. End of year targets have been set for your child in different subjects/areas. Teachers have then selected key objectives for the term that will support your **TARGET**) child to achieve these targets. It is really important that you work with your child to support them so that they achieve

or exceed their end of year targets. Reading at home with your child (as least 3 times a week) and ensuring they complete and return any other home learning activities that are set will support your child to meet these targets.

Your child has been given a log-in and password for this new resource which they can use to access it online at home as well as in school. We hope that with daily practise of facts your child will boost their times tables recall

speed. (I have been told it's quite competitive and so we may have a few school competitions with this!).

Harvest Festival – Last Sunday, our Ethos Council started our Harvest celebrations by taking part in the 10:30am church service at St. George's Church. Thank you to everyone who came along to support this - it was a great see so many of you! This afternoon, Rector Martin and Mrs Jeffries led our service in school. Again, it was great to see so many of you in school supporting our events. Many thanks to everyone who donated gifts as part of our Harvest celebrations. Next week we will start to combine gifts into Harvest hampers and distribute them to the nominated people within the local community.



Stay and Play sessions - So that you have a chance to speak to our Nursery and Reception staff and play alongside your child, we will be having a series of 'Stay and Play' sessions which will take place over the course of the year. Our first sessions are on:

Monday 1st October, 1:30pm-3pm for Reception parents/carers; Monday 15th October, 9:00am – 10:30am for Nursery parents/carers and Wednesday 17th October, 1:30pm – 3:00pm for Nursery parents/carers.

We very much hope you will be able to come to one of these sessions. Please come to the main school entrance on the days/times.



<u>School photographer</u> - We will receive our first visit of the year from the school photographer on Monday 8th October. Children with pre-school brothers and sisters (including nursery Monday afternoon children and children who do not usually attend on a Monday) can come into school from 8:30am to have their photographs taken. All other photographs will be taken during the school day. Photographs can be taken with siblings in family groups and also individually. A letter will be sent home next week so that you can indicate your preferred choice of photos.

Open afternoon – This year's first open afternoon with headteacher forum will be on **Tuesday 9th October** (1:30pm start) and will be for Nursery, Reception and KS1 parents/carers only. If your child is in these classes then you are invited into school to spend the first part of the afternoon in your child's class. For the second part of the afternoon you

are welcomed into the school hall to enjoy some refreshments and there is the opportunity to ask me questions about school life. It's quite an informal afternoon and provides you with the opportunity to gain an insight into life at our school.

Our first Class Worship of the year will be led by Y6AJM at 9:05am on Friday 12th October – I hope to see you there.



Parents' evening - You are invited to come into school to discuss your child/ren's start to the school year with their class teacher on Monday 15th October 3:30pm – 6:30pm OR Tuesday 16th October 3:30pm – 6:30pm. In order that we can accommodate everyone, you will be asked to select a time slot most convenient to yourselves. We will then collate the requests taking care to ensure that those with more than one child have appointments that don't clash. Your confirmed times will then be sent out to you. Please ensure that you arrive at the school's main entrance 5 minutes before your allocated time and take a seat in the area provided. The meeting with your child's teacher will take place in

the school hall with a strict time limit of 10 minutes. I will be available in the school hall on both days should you need to speak to me - no appointment will be necessary for this. Appointment letters are being sent out on Monday and are due to be returned to your child's teacher by Friday 5th October, with confirmed times being sent home before half term, on Wednesday 10th October.

Secondary School applications - For the parents/carers of children in Year 6, do not forget to complete your child's application for Secondary School by the closing date of **Wednesday 31st October**. The children have recently visited our local high school for a taster session and there have been lots of open evenings for you to attend. You will be notified in March next year of the name of the Secondary School that your child will be going to.



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Monthly attendance update – Each week we have a class attendance award. However, as our newsletter is produced monthly we thought that a monthly award could be a positive way of informing you of the progress we are making with regards to whole school and class attendance. This year we are aiming for every children and every class to be **above 98.0%**. As suggested as part of the '3 stars and a wish' responses, we will be looking to reward children for their attendance, at the end of the school year.
