New equipment – you will have hopefully seen by now our impressive new gym equipment installed on our playground. We are already planning with our school council how we can ensure that we use this equipment to its full potential with our children in Y3 – Y6 (and maybe even parents/carers!?). We also have further plans for more outdoor equipment for our younger children, but these things take time! To ensure that everyone is kept safe from harm, as with all our playground equipment/tyre parks,

we ask that you, and any children you may have with you, please refrain from using the equipment before or after school.

<u>September 2019 PE kits</u> – Please could you ensure that all children from Y1 – Y6 have both our indoor and outdoor PE kits as outlined in the pictures. Reception children only need the indoor PE kit.

The indoor PE kit should include:

- Plain navy blue shorts with school logo
- Plain white T-shirt with school logo
- Black Pumps



The outdoor kit should include:

- Plain navy blue hoody with school logo
- Plain navy blue tracksuit pants with school logo
- Trainers

On our plan below, children in **Nursery and Reception** will have an increased amount of time in our school hall than in previous years. Some of these sessions will be used for a physical 'indoor PE lesson' and some sessions may be used to do other activities. Nursery children do not need an indoor PE kit (just some PE pumps). However, we ask that Reception children do, and that this is kept in school all the time. In having the hall available each day, staff can take a flexible approach with their sessions and with the kit being in school, the children can get changed 'as and when' throughout the week. Children in **Year 3 and Year 4** will start swimming at the Pelican Centre **after February half term** and we have decided that on the days classes go swimming they can wear their outdoor PE kit to school. 
