Staffing updates



Congratulations to our Year 3 teacher, Miss Glassbrook, who has successfully been appointed to the role of Deputy Headteacher at St. Andrew's CE Infant School in Leyland. Miss Glassbrook has been teaching at our school since September 2012. She will start her new role in January and so will leave us at Christmas. We will all be sad to see Miss Glassbrook leave but I am sure you will all join me in wishing her every success in the next step in her career at St. Andrew's. A recruitment process will soon be taking place to ensure we have a Year 3 teacher in place for January.



There are also some changes taking place at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery as both Ms Naughton and Miss Booth will be leaving at Christmas. Ms Naughton and Miss Booth have both been at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery since we took it over in 2016. We will be sad to see them leave but I am sure you will join me in wishing them well for the future. A recruitment process recently took place and I am pleased to inform you that Mrs Cory was appointed as our new Nursery Manager, starting this role from January 2021. An advertisement will soon appear online as we look to find a new deputy manager to work at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery from January.

A big thank you to all parents/carers who helped with the learning of parts.

Reception 2021 intake – Should you know anyone with children starting school in September 2021 who will soon be submitting choices for which school they would like to attend, then please let them know that we do not have a formal open afternoon or evening. **We welcome people to come and look around our school at any time** and so please tell people to ring or email (using the details in the footer of this newsletter) and we will make an appointment to meet with me and have a 'safe' look round, following all COVID-19 guidance on visitors to school.

Remote Home Learning – Earlier this week we emailed you information about the online learning platform, 'Seesaw' that we have recently subscribed to. Throughout this week, your children have accessed their 'Seesaw' account in school with their class teacher and yesterday your child brought home their 'log in' information sheet. If you have not done so, please download the Seesaw 'App' and follow the log in instructions you received. In the first instance, our use of 'Seesaw' will be used to support teaching and learning with individuals or whole classes during periods of self-isolation or lockdown. Our aim is that from Monday 2nd November 2020, should your child be absent from school as they are self-isolating, then teachers will be setting remote home learning activities via the 'Seesaw' App. Over time, our teaching staff will further develop and explore the use of 'Seesaw' as we look to make full use of its capabilities with regards to home learning and communication between home and school. Remembrance events in school – This year, to avoid large gatherings, no Remembrance Sunday parades or outside services are being organised. In school, we are unable to have our usual visit from The Tyldesley Branch of the British Legion. Instead, our History leader, Miss Glassbrook will be leading Worship with each class in the hall, on a different day. Each class will also be preparing work to be used as part of a display which Mrs S Toone has already started to put together. We are also looking at organising for some children to walk to Tyldesley Cemetery with staff on Wednesday 11th November to lay a wreath at the Cenotaph.

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Well-Being – Staff in our school have always included, and taken into account, strategies and opportunities to develop positive mental health and well-being with our children. To support this further, upon our return to school this year, staff have started to trial various other strategies within their class to promote this and we recently ‘trailed’ the use of ‘The Stirling Children’s Well-Being Scale’ questionnaire with children in Year 4 – Year 6. This may be something that parents/carers of children in Year 4 – Year 6 talk about during the phone calls home in a couple of weeks.
