If your child was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2018 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2019, you can now submit an application for your child to

start our Reception class in September 2023. The closing date for admissions is <u>Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2023</u>. Should your child attend either of our nurseries and you have any questions or if you require any support with completing the form, then please do not hesitate to contact us in school. Should you know anyone with children starting school in September 2023, please let them know that, like every year, I will show people around school on an **individual basis**. Please ask people to ring or email (using the details in the footer of this newsletter) and we will make an appointment to meet with me and have a look round our school.

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**European Day of Languages** – We celebrated European Day of Languages in school on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> September. The morning began with a whole school worship introducing the ideas of European Day of Languages as well as thinking about why learning languages is so important. Our KS2 children then spent part of the day researching a European country and learning a popular children's song in that

language. The day culminated in a sharing assembly with a Eurovision theme, in which all KS2 classes shared some facts they had learned about their country and performed songs they had been practising.

<u>Harvest celebrations in school and church</u> – Our Harvest celebrations started in school on the day the last newsletter was sent out. In the morning, Reverend Cath, led a service with our Reception and KS1 children. Later in the day, Mrs Malley and Mrs Jeffries led the service with our KS2 children. Each class contributed to the services, which this year centred around Jesus feeding the 5000 and the theme of sharing. With this in mind, we added the non-uniform day to raise money for the Christian Aid Appeal to help with famine relief in East Africa. It was also great to see so many of our children and families in St. George's Church as part of the Sunday Harvest Service on 2<sup>nd</sup> October. Many thanks for your harvest gifts that you kindly donated. We will be in contact with Atherton and Leigh Foodbank to come and collect the donations so that they can be distributed within the community. A great example of a fantastic team effort from children, staff parents/carers and the community!



<u>Black History Month</u> – In October, we have been celebrating the incredible influences that black people and people from other cultures have had on our global society. Our school, was visited by the incredible black poet, Levi Tafari, who put on fantastic poetry workshops for all the children. We remembered the historic struggles that black people have encountered such as: slavery, segregation and apartheid. Within each class, we have had discussions, debates and produced work to celebrate their lives. Our children



carried on this research at home and we have been inundated with poems and pieces of art that have been inspired by a variety of inspirational black people. It has been a fantastic month of celebrating global diversity.



<u>Poet Visit and Green Room projects</u> – We celebrated National Poetry Day, by welcoming poet Levi Tafari back to St. George's Central. Levi was last in our school in September 2018 when he opened our fantastic school library. This year, the theme for National Poetry Day was 'The Environment'. We were lucky enough to hear Levi perform many of his poems based on this theme. Children across school took part in a whole host of poetic experiences to help them develop their poetic writing techniques as well as their speaking, listening and performing skills.
