<u>School updates</u> – Over the Easter holiday, work has taken place in our Forest School and we now have a new path, a fire pit and canopy in place. We have ideas to develop the tyre park area on our school playground. We will always continue to develop the learning environments across school so as to offer your children the very best facilities.



In newsletters this school year, we started to provide you with some background information about our school governors. The seventh one of these below is from Mrs Buck who is one of our parent governors:



I have been a parent governor since 2019. I live in Tyldesley, I am married and have two children who attend St. George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery. <u>Mr Kenny</u> – At the end of this academic year, Mr Kenny will be leaving St. George's Central to embark on a new career challenge as he leaves teaching to join the civil service. Mr Kenny joined us in January 2021 and we will be sad to see him leave. We are in the midst of the recruitment process for this position and I will communicate our progress with this appointment in due course.

'Active 60 Campaign' – During this week, children took part in Wigan's 'Active 60 campaign' encouraging all children to reach the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity every day. As part of the initiative, the children joined in with the 'World Daily Mile Day', where pupils were encouraged to complete a mile run around the school grounds. Children also looked at how physical activity can improve mental health.





<u>Year 4 Low Bank Ground residential trip</u> – Tuesday 2nd May will see over 30 of our Year 4 children make the journey to Low Bank Ground in the Lake District for a 3-night/4-day residential trip. The children will spend time exploring the countryside, orienteering and kayaking as well as completing many other outdoor and adventurous activities before they return home on the Friday. I am sure everyone is looking forward to this experience away from home.

<u>Staying open</u> – Although school will still be used as a Polling Station on <u>Thursday 4th May 2023</u> for the elections, our school will <u>REMAIN OPEN</u> on this day. Like recent years, the Music Room in our new extension will be used for this.





<u>King's Coronation Celebrations</u> – To celebrate the King's Coronation in school, the children will be focusing on the life of our new King and his achievements. On Friday 5th May we will be having a celebration day with a Worship in the morning and a Garden Party in the afternoon. Children can wear their party clothes on this day. We have made a card from the whole school, which will be posted, to the King. Look out on Seesaw for the 'Coronation Challenge' where the children will be asked to design a 'crown fit for the King'. Similarly, to the Jubilee Garden, we will be

developing an area of school to celebrate the King's Coronation – further details about this will be in our next newsletter.

Starting on <u>Tuesday 9th May</u>, all Year 6 children will be undertaking KS2 National tests – a timetable for the week will be sent home to children in Year 6. These tests are externally marked with the final outcomes being returned to school in July so that results can be sent home in your child's annual report. Please ensure children arrive at school in good time each day, well rested and ready to do their best.

Children in Year 2 will undertake their KS1 tests during week beginning Monday 15th May.

<u>School Books and new classes</u> – In order to ensure that children make an effective start to their learning in September, when they return to school on Monday 5th June, not only will every child from Reception – Year 5 be starting their new 'September' exercise books, but they will also spend that whole week in their September classroom, with their September teacher! The approach with exercise books has worked well for us over the last few years and this is the first time that your child will spend a week with their September teacher, at this stage of the years



years and this is the first time that your child will spend a week with their September teacher, at this stage of the year. On Monday 12th June, your child will return to their current teacher, before returning to their September teacher for two transition days in July. On Friday 26th May you will receive a letter informing you of your child's class for September 2023. Within this letter will be details regarding dropping off and collecting arrangements for this new transition week and for the two days in July. As usual, exercise books will be sent home at the end of the year, with a sample of school books being kept by class teachers.
