


<u>Reception starters 2023</u> – The link on the Wigan Council website for 2023 Reception places opened today: https://www.wigan.gov.uk/Resident/Education/Schools/School-Admissions/Primary-schools.aspx. If your child was born between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019, you can now submit an application for your child to

start our Reception class in September 2023. The closing date for admissions is <u>Sunday 15th January 2023</u>. Should your child attend either of our nurseries and you have any questions or if you require any support with completing the form, then please do not hesitate to contact us in school. Should you know anyone with children starting school in September 2023, please let them know that, like every year, I will show people around school on an **individual basis**. Please ask people to ring or email (using the details in the footer of this newsletter) and we will make an appointment to meet with me and have a look round our school.

<u>School photographs</u> – **Don't forget**.....we will receive our first visit of the year from the school photographer on **Monday 3rd October**. On this day he will visit both our Darlington Street School site for the morning and our Lancaster Avenue Nursery site for the afternoon. Please note:

- *photographs will be taken of children either individually or with school based siblings (see next bullet point);
- *only children who attend St. George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery will be photographed;
- *any Darlington Street Nursery children who do not usually attend Nursery on a Monday morning are invited to bring their child to school at 9:00am to have their photograph taken;



All children will have their photograph taken and a small 'sample' photograph will be sent home for you to decide if you would like to complete any purchases.



<u>London residential trip</u> – A short meeting will be held on **Wednesday 5th October** for the parents/carers of children in Year 6 regarding the planned trip to London in June 2023. The trip will be a great experience for these children as they near the end of their time at our school.

<u>Parent/carer workshops</u> – It was great to see so many of you at our recent workshops. Thanks to Mrs Leech and Mrs O'Brien for leading our whole school 'Inclusion workshop' and thanks to Mrs O'Brien, Miss Taylor Mrs Leech and Miss Ranger for leading the Early Reading/Phonics Workshop for KS1 parents/carers. Next Thursday will see Mrs O'Brien, Mr Hadjigeorgiou and Miss Killian lead the Early Reading/Phonics Workshop for Reception parents/carers at 3:30pm – 4:00pm or 6:00pm – 6:30pm.





<u>National Poetry Day</u> – Next Thursday is National Poetry Day: an annual mass celebration that encourages all to enjoy, discover and share poetry. This year, the theme is The Environment. Your children will take part in a whole host of poetic experiences which will not only help them to develop their poetic writing skills, but it will also support their writing in other areas as many techniques used when writing poems (metaphors, similes,

personification etc.) can be subtly used in other forms of writing. This year we have added, as part of our curriculum offer, a poem for your children to learn over the course of each half term so that they can perform it to others across school/in class. Each poem has been carefully selected so that it links to other topic areas that your children will be learning about and you will see in your child's year group how there is a poem in the English section. Puberty lessons – This half term, children in Year 5 and Year 6 will be visited by 'HH Kids' who will be delivering a specialised puberty package to support the delivery of our PSHE and Relationships and Sex Education curriculum. Class Worship and Musical Performances in school – We have planned for the children to share their learning with you from each class, via our 'usual' Class Worship approach. Before the next newsletter, Y6AM Class Worship will have taken place on Friday 14th October, 9:10am start in the school hall. There will also be regular musical performances by our musicians and our school choir throughout the year. The first one of these this year is on Wednesday 19th October, 9:15am start in the school hall. You are all very



welcome to attend these events in school. Please note: this year, no letters will be issued for any of our Class Worships or Musical Performances and there is no need for you to provide us with prior notice of your attendance. Simply turn up on the day and enjoy!



<u>Stay and plays and open afternoons</u> – Parents/carers of children in our Nurseries and Reception will be welcomed into school during week commencing Monday 17th October for the first of our 'Stay and Play' sessions. Please see either Miss Cowley, Mrs Davies, Mr Hadjigeorgiou or Miss Killian to sign up to one of the sessions, which will take place on various days and times during that week. During that same week, parent/carers of

children in Year 1 – Year 6 will have an opportunity to spend some time in school as our open afternoons re-commence. There is no need to sign up for any of the open afternoons, simply wait at the school office for the 1:30pm start.

Whole school residential plan – On Wednesday 19th October, there will be a meeting in school regarding the Year 5 February 2023 trip to Brathay Hall in the Lake District. Letters have recently been sent out to Year 5 children about this 4 night adventure. 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<u>Bikeability sessions</u> – Towards the end of this half term, some Year 6 children will be taking part in 'Bikeability' sessions. The children will be learning how to cycle safely on the road including signalling, positioning and how to complete safety checks on their bikes. A reminder for all that when bikes and scooters are brought onto our school site they are pushed and not ridden so as to reduce the risk of accidents.

<u>Sports Council</u> – Some members of the ATSA Sports Council came together at St. George's Central on Wednesday 21st September. The children listened to some information about ATSA before they worked with Mr Cooke to develop and discuss ideas to improve ATSA.

<u>VX Taster Session</u> – Five children from Year 5 and Year 6 recently took part in VX Taster Sessions at Fred Longworth High School. VX is an inclusive sport where competitors use a lacrosse style stick to aim soft balls at their opponents. Points are scored for hitting your opponent with the ball or for catching a ball that is aimed in your direction. The children will return on Monday 7th November to take part in the VX Competition.
