Year 3 and Year 4 trip to Deva Roman Discovery Centre – On Wednesday 20th November, children in Year 3 and Year 4 had a fascinating time in Chester as part of their learning about the Romans. On arrival at the Deva Roman Centre, children were greeted by Ancient Romans, who took them back 2000 years in time into Roman Britannia. The children immersed their senses in the Roman bath house, market street, and



amphitheatre as they watched the drama unfold as Gladiators fought it out to the death! The children also enjoyed a Roman soldier tour, carrying shields and marching through Chester to the amphitheatre, where they partook in Roman formation soldier training.

#### Musical performances and school choir events



Our school choir has been involved in a few events over the last few weeks. Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November saw our children join 'The Lottery Winners' on stage in Tyldesley Market Square to mark the switching on of the Christmas lights. The children performed brilliantly, singing a variety of traditional and more modern Christmas songs in front of an extremely large audience. Last week, the children



sang at the Community Carol Service at St. George's Church. It was great to see our children sing: 'When Christmas Comes to Town' and 'Mary's Boy Child'.



Parents/carers of children in Year 4 were recently treated to a tuned percussion performance from the children in Y4LB and Y4CB. Our school 'buys in' to the Wigan Music Service 'Wider Opportunities Music' scheme which means that each week a specialist music teacher (Mrs Lord) comes into our school to teach the children to play musical instruments. Our children learn to play a different percussion instrument each term – this term, the children have been learning to play

African drums. It was a great performance from the children. After Christmas, the children will be learning to play a different percussion instrument and there will be another whole school performance just before Easter.

Additionally, this week, our half-termly musical performance took place with our choir being joined by our musicians from across school so that they could perform to the many visitors who came along. As well as hearing the choir sing, it was great to see some of the children who learn instruments in school perform for everyone. The next musical performance in school will be on **Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> February 2024**.
