

On Tuesday 28th January we will be visited by 'Altru Drama' who will be undertaking some online safety workshops with KS1 classes and an online safety drama performance for KS2 classes.

Each class will experience a range of activities throughout the day to develop their understanding of Lunar New Year, including art, cooking and research. Friday 14th February will see us come together as a school to mark **International Childhood Cancer Day**.
