<u>Year 3 and 4 trip to The Lowry</u> – On Friday 24<sup>th</sup> January, children from Year 3 and Year 4 visited The Lowry as part of their art topic, 'What can you see in Lowry's paintings?' The children were able to view and explore Lowry's work, in the Modern Life: LS Lowry Collection Art Gallery. This was then complimented by an art workshop, in which the children took inspiration from Lowry's Industrial Scenes, to create their own piece of artwork. During the day, the children also participated in a drama workshop, which explored the work of Roald Dahl, in particular, our current English text, George's Marvellous Medicine. This involved the children getting into character to prepare them for their diary writing back at school.

<u>Year 5 and Year 6 South American Cooking Experience</u> – On Monday 27<sup>th</sup> January, children in Year 5 and Year 6 came together to sample some South American dishes linked to their Geography topic on Brazil. The children designed and baked their own Chipa Bread and made a Pollo Mechado stew.

Each class experienced a range of activities throughout the day to develop their understanding of Lunar New Year, including: art, cooking and research. It was a wonderful way to join in celebrations for the 'Year of the Snake'.





<u>Children's Mental Health Week</u> – We celebrated Children's Mental Health Week around this year's theme 'Know Yourself, Grow Yourself'. The children learned about the importance of self-awareness and explored what it means to them. They learned how emotions play a key role in our lives, and why being aware of how to listen to and express ourselves is a major part of building self-awareness. As part of



this celebration, we held a 'Dress to Express' Day where children were welcomed into school wearing an outfit to express their uniqueness. It was wonderful to see such diversity within our school!



<u>Brathay Hall</u> – Recently, 25 children spent a week at Brathay Hall in the Lake District for the annual Year 5 residential. The children spent the week exploring the countryside, orienteering, ghyll scrambling as well as many other outdoor and adventurous activities. I am sure the children had a great time away from home, experiencing all these different activities. Family members of the children who attended are invited to a short 'Brathay Hall assembly' at **9:05am on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> March** where the children will

share their experiences with you. On this day, the winner of the 'Alan Murgatroyd Award for Outdoor Education' will be announced and presented with their award.

On Friday 7<sup>th</sup> February, we came together as a school to mark 'Heart Month'. It was lovely to see children honour this by wearing something red. We learned about babies and children who require heart surgery and how we can show support as a community. On this day, we raised £233, which was donated to 'Healing Little Hearts' charity. Thank you all for your support.





<u>'Stay and Plays' and open afternoons</u> – It has been great to welcome you all into our school over the last few weeks to spend some time learning alongside your children. Thank you to everyone who visited.

<u>Musical performance</u> – Parents/carers were recently treated to our usual half termly musical performance. As well as hearing the choir sing, it was really good to see all the children who learn instruments in school perform for everyone. The next choir and musical performance in school will be on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2025.





On Friday 14<sup>th</sup> February, we came together as a school to mark **International Childhood Cancer Day**. It was heart-warming to see children honour this by wearing something orange. We learned about the brave children, adolescents and families that are affected by cancer and how we can show support as a community. On this day, we raised £280, which was donated to The Azaylia Foundation to support the fight against childhood cancer. Thank you all for your support.

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<u>World Book Day</u> – On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March, we will celebrating World Book Day in school. This is an annual celebration of authors, illustrators, books and the joy of reading. To celebrate this in school, children can come to school in non-uniform and bring in their favourite book to share. We will be receiving a visit from poet, Dom Colon who will work with classes delivering some creative reading and writing workshops.

<u>British Science Week</u> – Our Science leader, Miss Billington, will be arranging a variety of Science based activities during week commencing Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March to celebrate British Science Week. Thie theme this year is 'Change and Adapt'.
