Sun Protection in school – There are some steps you can take to help protect your child from the sun whilst in school. As children will be outside for a relatively short period of the day, we advise that they should come to school with a water bottle, a sun hat and sunglasses and that any sun cream should be applied at home before children come to school so that re-application in school will not be necessary. We will adapt any outdoor activities within our Early Years and PE sessions and children will be encouraged to drink from their water bottles on a regular basis throughout the day.

****Please note: as well as PE days, we are happy for your children to come into school in their school PE kit on hot days where you feel that this clothing will make them feel more comfortable. So that we have an agreed long-term approach in place, after half-term, you will receive a link to an online School Uniform consultation survey****

I am sure the children had a great time away from home, enjoying all these different experiences. VE Day 80th Celebrations – On Thursday 8th May, we celebrated VE Day 2025, marking 80 years since the end of World War Two. We started the day with a celebration worship of remembrance led by vicar, Michelle Evans. Throughout the day, we completed a range of different activities including: making spitfires, baking and research. Mrs Culshaw made us a VE Day themed lunch and a special VE Day cake to enjoy in the afternoon.

Reception Trip to 'Imagine That' in Liverpool – Reception had a fantastic time on their trip to Imagine That. The day was fun-filled with lots of different investigations and experiments! The children enjoyed making slime, snow, bath bombs and fridge magnets. They became fully immersed in the role play village, visiting the pizza parlour, hairdressers, supermarket, musical stage and construction site to name a few. It was a wonderful day.



KS1 trip to Blackpool – On Wednesday 14th May, children in Year 1 and Year 2 enjoyed a sunny day out in Blackpool. They visited Blackpool Tower and learnt about the history of Blackpool in the tower's 4D cinema before taking the lift to the top of the tower. Some of the children even braved the glass floor! The children also had a wonderful time on the beach before heading home.

Year 2 'camp' – Friday 16th May saw some of our Year 2 children return to school for a fun-filled sleepover, in tents on our school field. The children enjoyed using the archery equipment provided by Wigan Council BeWell team, playing mini golf and lots of playground games before having some supper and settling down in their tents for the evening. The following morning, after having some breakfast, the children went home. A fantastic time was had by all.



Musical performance – Parents/carers were recently treated to our usual half termly musical performance. As well as hearing the choir sing, it was good to see all the children who learn instruments in school perform for everyone. This was the final choir and musical performance of the year. The children have loved performing to an audience and have greatly improved in confidence over the course of this year.

'Stay and Plays' – It has been great to welcome parents/carers into our nurseries and Reception classes this week to spend some time learning alongside their children and taking part in a workshop about supporting their children to transition successfully to the next stage of their educational journey in September. Year 5 and Year 6 Curious Critters visit – On Thursday 22nd May, children in Year 5 and Year 6 received a visit from Curious Critters linked to their learning in Science on how plants and animals adapt to survive. Danny brought along different insects and animals and explained how these have adapted to survive in their natural environments. The children also had the opportunity to get up close with the different critters and handle them.

School Value: Hope


Reflective question: How does hope help to change your perspective?



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Assessment Week – During week beginning **Monday 9th June**, children in Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5 will undertake end of year assessments in Maths, Reading and Spelling Punctuation and Grammar. During this week, all children in Year 1 and some children in Year 2 will undertake a phonics screening check. This will be delivered by staff in school and will involve the children being tested on their knowledge of the sounds of letters, and groups of letters, within words. In the same week, children in Year 4 will also be undertaking the national ‘Multiplication Tables’ check. Your child’s results will be included in their end of year report that will be sent out on Friday July 11th July.



KS2 end of year production – Rehearsals for Y6 children have started and the children now know the part they will be playing in the end of year KS2 production – School of Pop. Y6 children will now need to spend the half-term break learning their lines so that, upon their return to school, they can ‘polish’ off their performance by practising on stage without the need for scripts. Although Y6 make up the main cast for this performance, the children from Y3, Y4 and Y5 play a major role in making up the choir that sing all the songs during the play (which is a key aspect in telling the story). The dates and times of the performances are included on the Summer Term (2nd half) dates letter, which is attached to the newsletter email.

Our sports days this year will take place on the following days:




Monday 16th June – Nursery

Parents’ Evenings – This year, we will be continuing with the additional Summer Term parents’ evening that has taken place for the last couple of years. The approaches year groups across school take may vary slightly, however the consistent element will be that the speaking will be led by your children. As well as yourselves, and the class teacher, I will be present at all Year 6 presentations as the children not only reflect on their time in Year 6 but also their time at our school. Flag American Football Taster Session – Thursday 8th May, saw some of our children take part in a Flag American Football Taster Session.
