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PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING 2016/17

Funding: £124,440 Eligible Pupils: 81

OVERVIEW

The school's Pupil Premium Funding in 2016/17 is £124,440. This funding is to provide additional support to pupils that are entitled to or have been entitled to Free School Meals in the last six years, or pupils who are Looked After by the Local Authority. The aim is that with this additional support their attainment is maximised and any perceived gap between them and Non Pupil Premium children is closed.

In making provision for pupil premium children, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged. We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered for, or qualify for, free school meals. Therefore we reserve the right to allocate the pupil premium funding to support any pupil the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.

This funding is used to provide many support systems and interventions. These fall into four broad categories:

- Addressing and assessing learning needs: phonics, spelling, grammar and reading comprehension, taught in flexible groupings.
- Addressing and assessing educational need through specialist assessment and individualised pupil programmes (both educational and behavioural).
- Addressing and assessing social need; accessing support for families via school based bespoke programmes such as health monitoring as well as support for attendance and punctuality.
- Providing enrichment to encourage learning and set a context for it: trips, visits, visitors, sports, art, music and practical first hand daily experience of relevant learning opportunities.
